

## Welcome to CUBjam 2026!

We have made it! Its finally time to be a clown, acrobat or ringmaster for 3 days!

But first here is a short list of things you need to do before camp.

**1) Write the first names of everyone on the badges**

If you have asked your cubs to rate climbing/shooting/archery etc then pick the badge based on their choices. If not just allocate them as you see fit.

**Note : This is best done with a sharpie and your subcamp leaders have spares.**

**2) Complete the key along the bottom of the badge – see attached for notes on key**

Please colour in any circle that is applicable to each individual cub based on the notes provided.

**3) Take a photo of your group**

Take an individual or a group photo when all your cubs have arrived. If a cub goes missing, you can then share a current photo with security.

**4) Keep a log of the cubs badges**

Invariably at least one cub will lose their badge. We are NOT aware of which badge is allocated to which cub so it is up to you to keep a log. You can do this in one of two ways, either take a photo of every cub holding up the back of their badge or complete the attached list which contains all the badge numbers, or do both! You also have a copy of every badge and your subcamp leaders have spare badges and are able to help you to make a new one.

**Note : Cubs will also break badges, your sub camp leaders have a repair kit for this too !**

**5) Volunteer some of your leaders to help during activity times**

Your subcamp leader has a list of activities that require volunteers. All slots need to be filled. Every activity has a leader, but some activities require extra support. This help is greatly appreciated and enables the activities to run smoothly during Saturday and Sunday, please make sure you arrive 15 mins before the first activity starts in that zone. The help is only required in the zone where your cubs are so you will never be far away from them. Under 18s can volunteer to help out too.

Finally have an amazing camp.

## Welfare Team

The team is here to support Cubs and Leaders throughout the camp during the day. This support can be accessed in a number of ways. A young person or leader can visit the hub and chat with the team at any time. Activity leaders can call on the team if required if they recognise that someone requires support. The team will be also be available in the activity areas and they will be wearing the Hi Viz Necker (see picture).

At the start of camp, leaders are welcome to bring Cubs along to the Welfare Hub to introduce them to the team and allow them to explore what the hub has to offer. Cubs do not need to have a formal diagnosis to access support. The Welfare Team is there to support anyone who has a need, including neurodiversity, anxiety, mental health concerns, feeling overwhelmed, or simply needing a bit of time out.



## Cub of the Camp

Please can each section pick one cub they feel has tried really hard / been really helpful / put the most effort into dressing up. It is completely up to you how you set the criteria you use to select the cub. When you have selected the cub please can you let your sub camp leader know by Sunday morning so we have a list completed by 12 ready for the closing ceremony. The cubs selected will be called out as a whole subcamp and given a prize.

During the opening and closing ceremony a small number of pyro technics are planned to be used. If you have cubs that are sensitive to noises or surprise sounds, then make sure they are aware and locate them near the back of the big top.
